1. Compass Commission Initiative





- In 2010, the Ministry of Planning of Chile (MIDEPLAN) instructed the Abdul Latif Jameel Poverty Action Lab (J-PAL) to convene a commission of experts.
- The Compass Commission was tasked with:
 - identifying Chilean challenges in terms of social policy; and
 - proposing innovative public policies that could be evaluated using randomized control trials.

3. Development of the Commission



■ 1st Stage: Identification of Social Policies

- Identifying key policy questions for social development in Chile.
- Development of proposed interventions and evaluation strategies.
- □ Duration: 5 sessions.

3. Development of the Comission





2nd Stage: Policy proposal

- Meetings with ministries and relevant organizations
 - evaluate the administrative and political viability of initiatives; and
 - feasibility of evaluations.
- November 19th 2010: The Minister of Planning selected the four most relevant and interesting ideas.

3. Development of the Commission





- 3rd Stage: Implementation and evaluation design
 - Division into four sub-groups to advance the work.
 - Refinement of details of implementation and evaluation design.
 - Second round of meetings with relevant ministries and organizations.
 - March 10th, 2011: Official presentation of the Commission's final report to MIDEPLAN.

4. Final proposals





■ 3 areas – 4 programs

1) Education

- Information regarding subsidies provided to vulnerable families to expand school options.
- ✓ Incentives and support for teachers to improve quality and results.

2) Crime

Rehabilitation + Social reintegration for offenders.

3) Opportunities for youth

 Labor market intermediation + Mentoring + Health information to prevent risky behaviors and labor market inactivity.

5. Future of the Compass Commission





- Three of four final proposals are currently being adapted for the implementation in:
 - National Institute of Youth (INJUV)
 - Ministry of Interior
 - Ministry of Education
- With the support and leadership of the Ministry of Planning.
